



NAVIGATIONAL RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP 2016

Supplementary Regulations

- 1 The Scottish Association of Car Clubs will promote a Championship to be known as the "Scottish Navigational Rally Championship 2016".
- 2 The MSA Championship Registration Number is: 82/2016
- 3 The Championship will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association Ltd (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any other written instructions issued by the Championship organisers.
- 4 **Eligibility**
 - (i) The Championship is open to members of any club affiliated to the Scottish Association of Car Clubs (SACC). In the event of a club ceasing to be a member of the Association, competitors may only count points gained from events entered under that club up to the date of that club ceasing its membership.
 - (ii) Entry into the Championship is by any of the following two methods.
 - (a) Competitors can complete and return an entry form to the Championship Administrator at any point in the duration of the Championship via post, e-mail or in person.
 - (b) Competitors can enter the National B Navigational section of any Championship event. Entry to Clubman, 12-Car or Historic sections of events does not count. While entry is automatic to the Championship, competitors can withdraw by e-mailing or writing to the Championship Administrator. This must be done within 14 days of the first event in which they compete.
 - (iii) There is no limit to the number of competitors.

5 Classes

- (i) The Championship will consist of six classes, with separate classes for drivers and navigators at three levels of experience.
- (ii) The eligibility requirements at each level will be defined as follows:

EXPERT	Open to any competitor.
NON-EXPERT	Limited to competitors who have, in any one calendar year from 2010 to 2015, scored no more than four class wins as a navigator at Non-Expert/Intermediate or higher level on navigational events of Clubman or higher status. Note: the restriction on navigating experience also applies to competitors intending to drive at Non-Expert level.

NOVICE	<p>Limited to competitors who have, whilst navigating, been classified as a finisher in no more than 6 navigational events of Clubman or higher status between 1st January 2014 and 31st December 2015 or</p> <p>been classified as a finisher in no more than 4 navigational events in any one calendar year since 1st January 2010.</p> <p>Note: the restriction on navigating experience also applies to competitors intending to drive at Novice level.</p>

For the purpose of the above definitions, a navigational event includes any Road Rally, Historic Road Rally, Targa Rally or Navigational Rally.

- (iii) Competitors are expected to inform the Championship Co-ordinator if they are not eligible to register for a class in the Championship under which they enter a Championship event. If the Championship Co-ordinator has information available to them that a competitor is not eligible to be registered they may not include the competitor in the list of registered competitors.
- (iv) Competitors may register for more than one class provided they are eligible for each class they register for.

6 **Points**

- (i) Points will be awarded to each competitor who starts each event based on their final position relative to all other registered championship competitors in the same class. Competitors may only score points in one class on any single event.
- (ii) The following scale of points will be used

Class Position	Points	Class Position	Points
1 st	12	7 th	5
2 nd	10	8 th	4
3 rd	9	9 th	3
4 th	8	10 th or higher	2
5 th	7	Non-finisher e.g. OTL	1
6 th	6	Excluded	0

- (iii) A competitor will be awarded the following points for helping to organise or run a Championship event

Position	Points awarded
Clerk of the Course, Event Secretary	12
Other Officials named in event SRs	10
Other signed-on Officials. e.g. marshals	9

- (a) Organisers' points will be only be awarded once. The highest points value attained during the year will be the value used. In the event of event cancellation, the organisers' points will not be awarded.
- (b) Points for Clerk of the Course, Secretary of the Meeting and other Officials named in event SRs will be awarded automatically and will be taken from event Supplementary Regulations.

- (c) Points for being a Signed-on Official must be claimed from the Championship Co-ordinator within 7 days of the Championship event they wish to claim points for.
- (d) Points will be awarded to the class for which the official is registered as a competitor. If an official is registered for more than one class they must inform the Championship Co-ordinator within 7 days of the event which class they wish the points to awarded for, failing this the points will be awarded to class for which the official last scored points as a competitor. If an official has not registered for the Championship, the points will be awarded retrospectively to the class for which they first register.

- (iv) A competitor's total score will count their best scores up to a maximum number of events, determined by the number of events which take place, as follows:

Number of events which run	9	8	7	6	5	4	3	2
Number of scores counted	7	6	5	4	4	3	2	2

- (v) Championship ties will be resolved using the following criteria and in the following order. All events will be counted.
 - (a) In favour of the competitor with the greater number of 1st place scores, then 2nd place scores, etc.
 - (b) In favour of the higher placed competitor (as per the event final results) on the first event at which all tied competitors were present.
 - (c) In favour of the higher placed competitor (as per the event final results) who competed on the earliest event in the championship.
- (vi) Interim results will be posted electronically on the SACC Website after each event, and Provisional Results will be published as soon as possible following the last event. Discrepancies should be notified to the Championship Administrator within 7 days of publication.
- (vii) The following awards will be made:
 - 1st in each class Trophy + Award
 - Best event (see ix) Trophy + Award
- (viii) Awards will only be presented to competitors if they have competed and/or officiated at two or more events. Awards are perpetual, but trophies remain the property of the Scottish Association of Car Clubs and are to be held for 11 months.
- (ix) The "best event" will be the event with the highest average score from competitors' questionnaires. These questionnaires will be circulated as soon as possible in the Championship and can be either submitted on completion of an event or at the end of the Championship to the Co-ordinator. While the completion of questionnaires is not compulsory, contenders are requested to do so as they provide valuable feedback for event organisers and hopefully maintain a consistently high standard of events.

7 Protests & Championship Officials

- (i) All eligibility challenges, disputes, irregularities or appeals should be addressed to the Championship Co-ordinator who will liaise with the Championship Stewards.
