SMS Chairman, and MSA Director - Tom Purves.

Tom Purves: Rory did a very good job on the developing the strategy, and it got a very positive reception from SportScotland.

It was important to keep heads down about Sport Scotland application until we had something concrete to announce, then we could make a noise about it (soon). Scotland the only part of the UK putting money into motorsport, apart from the Wales Rally GB deal which is on a different basis for a single event..

The important part is increasing involvement in the sport – marshals and competitors - and the clubs are important in that.

It was and is important to work with Scottish Auto Cycle Union, to speak with one voice to the Scottish Government; we have a good relationship and that will continue.

Under Colin Hilton the MSA did a good job of regulating the sport and got it's finances secured, but now is time to concentrate on development.

MSA has turned a corner, some new energetic young managers on board. New Technical, Safety and Development directors.

Ben Taylor now running IMS, and the British Rally Championship is back, in good shape.

MSA is also involved in a governance review – tenure, roles and responsibilities – and a strategy review.

Our sport is not growing – numbers flat or reducing (e.g. karting) – increasing age of licence holders, in an ageing population.

GoMotorsport – Alison Clark

Each RDO has been given an event fund available to help clubs take motorsport to non-motorsport events.

Consider a stand at Royal Highland show; cost depends on size of stand and location. Think it would need to be big enough for at least three cars of different disciplines.

No vehicle may be driven during the event!

Need budget of £1500 - £2000? Half from MSA. Apply for stand, see what is available, decide whether worthwhile.

Harry Merry - CSMA tried this two-three years ago, attracted people who said they used to do motorsport, didn't attract new people.

David Baker – Aberdeen DMC are taking a stand at an event in Buchan area. If funding is available, how can they apply for it?

Tom Purves: we run Regent Street Motor Show every year in London, 450,000 people. Experience shows that something active will attract more attention than just static vehicles.
