Report to the SAMSC General Meeting, Tuesday 19 March 2019

The Volunteers training programme has continued to provide quality training throughout 2018. Training has covered Race, Rally, Kart, Speed and specialist disciplines such as Rescue and Recovery, and been organised through the Association and by the Scottish Motor Racing Club, Stonehaven & District Motor Club and Association of Motorsport Recovery Operators. During the course of the year there were 15 training events. During the year the Scottish Motor Racing Club initiated a Volunteers Development Programme, aimed at providing more bespoke development and volunteer engagement within their marshalling cadre.

The programme invested 58 instructor-days of time to provide 290 delegate-days of training. Just over 80% of delegates were male and over 55% of delegates rated the training excellent, with a further 44% rating the training good. Despite this many training days failed to attract significant attendances, and despite more frequent communication through newsletters club engagement was generally low.

The Association was fortunate in receiving £12,938 of charitable funding courtesy of the British Motor Sport Training Trust. The Trust had offered in excess of £10,000 in additional grant aid that we were unable to use due to lack of support. Despite this the Trust has been able to offer over £18,500 in grant aid to our training programme in 2019.

2019 has made a strong start with an excellent Radio training day promoted by Scottish Motorsport Marshals Club, and a rally training day in Inverness promoted by Highland Car Club. More recently Scottish Motor Racing Club have run their annual marshals training which has been highly successful.

Clubs are reminded that the training programme is planned during the spring and summer for the following year.

Plans for the remainder of 2019 are provided overleaf, although regrettably the organisation of these events falls on a very small number of people, which is leading to delays in promoting events.
